■ Science –

Grade 6 Science completed their Matter Unit and after the winter break they will begin their third unit which focuses on forces, motion and Newton's Laws.

Grade 7 Science is working thorough their Form and Function unit which focuses on the functioning of living things.

Grade 8 students are in Unit 2, Mastodons and Megalodons. At the end of the unit, students will be required to design a museum exhibit for a pre-historic time in Earth's history. This must be a physical model. Details will be sent home after the break.
